

POLICY #2624 GRADING SYSTEM

The Board of Education recognizes that a system of measuring, recording, and reporting the achievements of individual pupils is important to the continuing process of learning.

The Board directs that the instructional program of this district include a system of grading in grades K through twelve consistent with the educational goals of the district. Grades will measure the progress of pupils against program objectives.

Pupils shall be informed at the outset of any course of study of the behaviors and achievements that are expected of them and shall be kept informed of their progress during the course of study. As a rule, grading should reward pupils for positive efforts and minimize failure, and pupils should be encouraged to evaluate their own achievements.

The Superintendent shall develop review in consultation with teaching staff members and parents, a grading program appropriate to the course of study and maturity of pupils. The final decision on any contested grade will be the responsibility of the building principal. A pupil classified as disabled will be graded in accordance with his or her individualized educational program.
