

Policy #5511.1f Policy Permitting School Uniforms at Landis Middle School

Pursuant to the Board's Master Policy on School Uniforms, the principal, faculty and parents of Landis Middle School requested that the Board adopt a policy permitting uniforms at Landis School. Following a detailed presentation by representatives of the Landis School, this Board finds that a policy permitting school uniforms will enhance the learning environment at Landis School and hereby grants the request for a school uniform policy.

1. There is hereby established for Landis Middle School, a school uniform consisting of the following wardrobe:

GIRLS: Red or White polo shirt; and Blue slacks, skirts, or shorts

BOYS: Red or White polo shirt; and Blue slacks or shorts

All determinations regarding student compliance with these school uniform specifications shall be made by the principal.

2. The principal shall develop positive incentives and positive reinforcement measures to encourage participation in the school's uniform program. The principal and/or his/her designees shall communicate with parents so that expectations and benefits are understood and achieved.

3. No student shall be considered non-compliant with any school's uniform policy under the following circumstances:

a.) when the student's parent/guardian has elected that his/her student not participate in the school's uniform program and has provided written notice of such decision to the school's principal;

b.) due to financial hardship the parent/guardian, though willing to participate, cannot afford to furnish the uniforms;

c.) when the student is wearing the uniform of a nationally recognized youth organization such as the Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts on a day when a meeting of the organization is scheduled.

4. No student at Landis Middle School shall be denied admission, penalized academically or discriminated against for noncompliance with the uniform policy.

5. The principal shall develop and implement detailed procedures for the identification of and a mechanism to assist students who are economically disadvantaged, including:

1.) procedures for dissemination of cost information to parents;

2.) procedures and criteria to identify families in need of financial assistance;

3.) identification of public and private resources for financial assistance to families;

4.) designation of specific individual or individuals to assist those families in applying for financial aid.

This policy shall not preclude students who participate in a nationally recognized youth organization which is approved by the Board of Education from wearing organization uniforms to school on days that the organization has scheduled a meeting. The principal shall maintain a list of approved organizations.

The principal shall design and implement at the end of each school year an evaluation of the effectiveness of the school's uniform program. A report of that evaluation shall be

submitted to the Board and Superintendent by July 1st immediately following the close of the school year.
